### **Remember Your Baptism**

We don't know all the details when Jesus was baptized, but this is how the Gospel of Matthew tells the story in chapter 3 verses 13 through 17 "Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him.



John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw God's Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from the heavens said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We hear that he is baptized by John, God's Spirit comes in the form of a dove, and a voice speaks. Just as Jesus has a story of his baptism, you have a story about yours. I hope you find ways to continue to share your story with others. These stories are centered around these promises that are mentioned in the service of baptism in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal: to live with God's faithful people, being immersed in God's Word, participating in the Holy Supper, having the Bible placed in your hands, learning the Lord's Prayer, learning the Creed, learning the Ten Commandments, strengthened in faith and prayer, trusting God, and serving in ways of justice and peace. Through this gift, you have been claimed, named, and called beloved and made one of God's very own. Not by what you do, but what God has already done in and through Jesus Christ. Nothing can change or diminish this promise. So, in times of being thankful for someone or something, remembering that Jesus is King, recalling the highlights of this church year, looking ahead to a new church year that will begin on November 30th as we welcome another Advent, in whatever challenges you encounter, whatever obstacles you have, and whatever lies ahead, remember your baptism. Plus, be assured once again that nothing can change or dimmish this promise. That's right. Our identity is in the waters of Holy Baptism and can never be taken away. I wonder what it would have been like to be present that day to witness and experience first-hand the baptism of Jesus, but really it is quite amazing to know that we are truly one of God's very own and nothing can change that. I give thanks for you; beloved child of God and thanks be to God. Amen.



#### **Old Business:**

- Constitution status update: We are awaiting Synod review. Once received we will review/ incorporate these updates into our draft. An update to the members will be included in the November and December Ways of Grace. SE Synod anticipates a November review/ approval of Grace's constitution.
- The Pastors, Troy and Chery continue to contact candidates for next year's council leadership.
- The sanctuary screens should be operative for October 26th Reformation/Confirmation services. A big thank you to Blake for all his hard work!

#### **New Business:**

• Preliminary 2026 budget discussion. Budget recommendation will be at our next meeting. Once approved, the budget becomes effective after the annual meeting.

- Corey has been contacted by two churches about having a security training due to recent church/school shootings. Inquired whether we would also be interested and Council would like more information if this training becomes available.
- Four new households have joined Grace! Please be sure to check out the new member bulletin board to learn their names and faces. And thank you to our congregation who continues to welcome all!

Pastor Cole's Report: Pastor Cole has submitted a grant proposal for an ELCA domestic hunger grant for our community garden. The 7th through 12th grade lock-in has been scheduled for January 3rd. BLAST will have a fire drill evacuation on October 29th. Good Earth Village has been contacted about scheduling confirmation camp for the summer. A draft of a possible nine-month part time Youth Coordinator position was included in Pastor Cole's report.

Pastor Allison's Report: Attended the "Fall Theological Conference" in La Crosse. The theme was "Baptism in Muddy Waters" which reminds us of our identity as children of God and that God is with us in all areas of life. Looking for persons to create slides for use with our sanctuary screens. Working with Nicole to streamline the Office Assistant role by working with volunteers or simplifying tasks. Continue to work with the Stewardship Team regarding income generation for our church and growing a culture of year-round generosity of time, talents, and treasures. Reminder that Nicole needs the December/January newsletter info by November 15 and annual reports by December 15th, 2025.

### **Update and Modernization of Church Constitution**

The Church Council identified the constitution and its bylaws as priority documents and began researching the process to update them in early 2024. Grace Lutheran Church is a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), and we are supported locally by the Southeastern MN Synod of the ELCA. The Synod was very helpful, and we learned right away this would be a lengthy process, but there was clear guidance on how to get it done. The Synod recommends that congregations review and update their constitution at least every three years. Grace Lutheran Church has not updated its constitution or bylaws since 2012. In the summer of 2024, the Church Council started its review process and that work has led to this update.

The Council began by reviewing Grace Lutheran's existing church constitution and bylaws as well as the model constitution that is provided by the ELCA. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly provides this model constitution as a starting point for the congregation, and it includes both required and recommended provisions from the ELCA. This model provides direction to be consistent with the governing documents of the ELCA as well as allowing organizational flexibility for local congregations.

While much of our existing constitution aligned with the model constitution, there were areas that needed to be modified or customized to Grace Lutheran Church. The council had discussions and made revisions to these documents. The Council then proceeded to merge the documents using the ELCA model as the base. Following a review of the merged document, a final draft was created. This final draft was submitted to the Synod in July 2025 for their review and approval.

Synod approval is expected this Fall. Any changes from the synod will be incorporated into a final version of the constitution that will be brought to the members of Grace for approval at the annual

meeting in January 2026. A copy of the final document will be available for review ahead of that meeting. Please take time to review the document and reach out to myself or either of the pastors with questions or comments. This is an important project for our congregation, and I want to thank the church staff and all the council members that have provided valuable input in this process.



### Rivers of Living Water: Overflowing Generosity in Faith Personal Goals and Commitment

What defines your life? Is it wealth? belongings? faith? Many of us live with a scarcity mentality, worried that we must gather and hoard as much as possible, saving for some imagined "rainy day." Others go to the opposite extreme, focusing on self-gratification. But the Bible promises both God's blessings and joy for those who choose to live another way.

As you prayerfully consider your giving in 2026, a great question to ponder is, "Where do you find living water through the ministries of Grace Lutheran Church?" With our theme

of *Rivers of Living Water: Overflowing Generosity in Faith*, we are reminded that in our baptism, we are forgiven and freed to live with overflowing love for God and our neighbor. In John's gospel, Jesus proclaims, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water." (John 7:37-38)

In the gathering area, the visual image of the baptismal font flowing into the ministries of Grace illustrates this overflowing living water. Your financial offering provides for Administration, Worship, Youth and Families, Fellowship and Outreach, and Facilities and Maintenance. Where does your life overflow with God's grace and how do you feel led to contribute to God's work through this congregation? Where is the Holy Spirit nudging you to give of your time, your skills, your attendance, and your financial support? Where can you share your blessings to bless others?

Later this month, you will be receiving an Estimate of Giving Commitment Card in the mail. On a practical level, we ask our members to turn in an estimate of giving commitment cards so that our Service Team can set an accurate ministry budget for the coming year. This allows us to make the most of every dollar given to the church.
