

The young, the old, the middle aged, here seek the water's side, to tread the path the Savior trod, into the yielding tide. O let the Spirit Dove descend, as once o'er Jordan's wave, and rest on all who here arise, from the baptismal grave."

-Baptist Pastor Sydney Dyer's baptism hymn from 1852.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In 1852, when this good old baptism hymn was written, baptisms were typically done by immersion in the local lake or stream. When one was fully submerged, and unable to breathe under water, it mimicked being in the grave, just as our Lord was in the tomb. And just as Jesus was raised from the dead, the one being baptized was raised from the water to take in a full breath of new life, sustained by the Holy Spirit.

Today, we might miss that connection to Easter in our baptisms where we sprinkle a little water on the head of the one being baptized. Yet we continue to understand this sacrament as our connection from dying to sin to being raised to new life promised by God at our baptism, where we are claimed as God's beloved, sealed with the Holy Spirit, and marked eternally with the cross of Christ.

This Lenten season, we are focusing on what keeps us from living that full life as disciples that God is calling us to in our baptism. We began our season of Lent by teaching our young ones what it means to repent, and that repenting is an action word. During the children's sermon, the kids were asked to face the congregation and then on the count of three, when I said "repent," we all did a jump turn and faced the cross.

This physical action of turning ourselves, the entirety of our lives, from our own ways to God's ways is what we intentionally practice this season of the church year. We take a deep dive into our sinfulness and what separates us from God and our neighbor and leave that baggage behind as we confess our sin and ask for God's mercy and forgiveness. And at the table each week, Jesus offers us himself for the forgiveness of our sins and we are given new life.

Turning to God has been the theme of our Lenten season which will come to a close as we move from Palm Sunday on April 13 to Easter on April 20. I would like to personally invite you to continue this journey with Jesus from the parade of palms to the empty tomb, and not to miss the important days in between. It is on those days that we see our own humanity up close in the last days Jesus had with his disciples and understand even more why we need a savior.

Invite a friend, and attend our evening Maundy Thursday worship, April 17, where we will recall the last supper that Jesus had with his disciples. We will hear how he washed their feet, feet of the ones he loved and who loved him, but also who would deny him and betray him. We will watch as the altar is stripped bare and hear these words of despair as read from Psalm 22. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? 2 O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest."

We leave that service in the dark and quiet to ponder what Jesus must have felt that night and return the next day, on Good Friday, to hear the seven last words of Jesus. This service, at Noon and 6:30PM, will be readings and hymns, as we hear how Jesus left that upper room meal with his friends and was escorted by soldiers to face punishment and death on a cross. We leave Good Friday worship with Jesus dying with a criminal on his right and one on his left, and his body is place in a sealed tomb. All hope seems lost. The ministry and mission of God to save the world would seem to have been defeated. And yet what seems to be the worst thing possible opens to the Good News that God has in store.

On Easter morning, at 6:45AM, we will take the baggage box full of our sin and shame, our guilt and things we need to forgive and be forgiven for and add the fire of God's Holy Spirit. The Spirit's flames refine us, strip from us what is not life giving, and lighten our load from the sinfulness we carry so that we can indeed turn our whole selves to God. At 7AM, our sunrise service begins, and we light the Christ Candle from those flames.

In the dark of the sanctuary, piece by piece, the altar will be re-dressed. And then the light of Christ will enter, bringing light that has overcome all of the darkness in the world. The lights will be brought up, the smell of lilies will fill the air, and alleluias will ring out as the tomb is now empty. Death could not contain the love of God! Jesus has risen from the dead and invites us to share in this resurrected life with him.

In addition to our sunrise service, we will also have 8:30AM traditional and 10:45AM contemporary services. On behalf of your pastors and staff, we hope you are able to come and share in this joyful celebration together. It is a blessing to worship with you!

Mid-Week Lenten Worship! The season of Lent began on Wednesday, March 5, with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a season of repentance and self-examination where we see what is not life-giving, ask for God's forgiveness, and turn our lives back around to God. In the sanctuary, you will find a black box which is our Baggage Box. During this season, you are invited to write down any burden, sin, shame, or fear that is weighing you down and holding you back in your life and relationship with God and one another. On Easter morning, we will burn this box

as a symbol of the refining fire of the Holy Spirit, lighting the Christ Candle from these flames. Confirmation students and their mentors are asked to worship together on Wednesdays in Lent as we sing *Unfailing Light* together with a time for discussion, ending at 7:15PM. We will also offer *Holden Evening Prayer* Wednesdays at noon in the chapel. A meditation will be read each week that focuses on a symbol in the Easter story. We hope you will come for a time of mid-week reflection, to take a breath, and acknowledge the presence of Christ in our midst.





Cinnamon Swirl Bread Recipe

Take this Bread: Bread for our Neighbors! Please bake three mini loaves in place of the one 9x5 loaf called for in the recipe. Cool and wrap loaves in saran wrap, leaving them in their foil pan. Return loaves on God's Grace is Amazing Day, Sunday May 18th, by 9AM in the fellowship hall. No nuts please! Thank you!!!

NOTE: Prepare as directed but use 3 mini loaf pans instead of 1 regular pan. Cook time will vary - approximately 30-40 minutes.

Ingredients:

- 1 1/3 cups white sugar, divided
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1 cup milk
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil

Directions:


Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease a 9x5-inch loaf pan. Mix together 1/3 cup sugar and 2 teaspoons cinnamon in a small bowl; set aside. Combine flour, remaining 1 cup sugar, baking powder, and salt together in a large bowl. Combine egg, milk, and oil in a separate bowl; add to flour mixture. Stir until just moistened.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

The Church Council has partnered with the Stewardship Committee to issue a challenge to the members of Grace. Beginning on April 27 we are challenging the families of Grace to add \$5 per week to their offering. Special envelopes have been made for this challenge and are available in the gathering space. This challenge will run for five months. If 100 families participate with an additional \$5/week in their offering, Grace Lutheran will see an extra \$10,000 in the general fund giving!

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, April 6 - Fifth Sunday in Lent

Our God makes all things new. In the first reading God promises it. In the gospel Mary anticipates it, anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume in preparation for the day of his burial. In the second reading Paul recalls his transformation from the persecutor Saul into an apostle. In baptism, God's new person (you!) rises daily from the deadly mire of trespasses and sins.

First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

Second Reading: Philippians 3:4b-14

Gospel: John 12:1-8

Sunday, April 13– Palm Sunday

Today we follow Christ from triumphal entry to the cross, each waypoint of the journey marked by Jesus' compassion for those who would betray, mock, accuse, or do violence to him. Though persecuted and beaten, Jesus the Son of God is not disgraced; instead, he asks forgiveness for those who put him to death. We have walked the Lenten pathway these forty days, each of us invited through baptism to "let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." We enter this holy week accompanying Jesus to the cross with both grief and thanksgiving in our hearts, trusting in God's redeeming love.


