Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy Easter! Did you know that in the Christian calendar, we celebrate Easter for 7 weeks? This is more than double the time we celebrate Christmas with three weeks of Christmas Eve, Epiphany, and the Baptism of Jesus. While the Christmas season in our secular culture is full of twinkle lights, trees, gifts, and glitter, we remember in the church each December the promise of a newborn king who will come and save the world from sin and death. We rejoice with angels at his birth and hold his beloved parents in our hearts.

It is the heart of Mary that Simeon speaks to when Jesus is dedicated as an infant in the temple. He proclaims to Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed —and a sword will pierce your own soul, too." (Luke 2: 34- 35) Easter is a celebration, yes, but we had to travel through many weeks of Lent first. We walked with Jesus through temptation, betrayal, doubt, grief, fear, and agony he experienced as he went from beloved rabbi to hanged criminal. We also must remember what the prophet Simeon shared in the temple as Jesus was dedicated.

²⁸ Simeon took [Jesus] in his arms and praised God, saying, ²⁹ "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word, ³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation, ³¹ which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, ³² a light for revelation to the gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." (Luke 2: 28-32)

But for Jesus to deliver his people, to be their salvation, Jesus took on the sin of the world. That extreme heaviness might be why we celebrate with joy for 7 weeks at Easter because the tomb was truly empty. The stone had been rolled away. Jesus is alive! And he has conquered death so that we would have that life too. Life meant to be lived in joy and hope. Life lived abundantly or as some other translations say, to live life to the fullest.

So, what does it mean to live life to the fullest? I believe a full life walking as a disciple of Jesus means ordering our days around community, sabbath, worship, and service. To be with other believers to support one another. To take at least one day a week to rest and be with God, to stop working, and praise God for all the blessings we have been given. To worship regularly and meet Jesus in the Word, the bread and wine, and in one another. And to serve our neighbor by using the time, talents, and treasures that God provides.

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, April 7 - Second Sunday of Easter The Easter season is a week of weeks, seven Sundays when we play in the mystery of Christ's presence, mostly through the glorious Gospel of John. Today we gather with the disciples on the first Easter, and Jesus breathes the Spirit on us. With Thomas we ask for a sign, and Jesus offers us his wounded self in the broken bread. From frightened individuals we are transformed into a community of open doors, peace, forgiveness, and material sharing such that no one among us is in need.

First Reading: Acts 4:32-35 Second Reading: 1 John 1:1--2:2 Gospel: John 20:19-31

Sunday, April 14 - Third Sunday of Easter The gospel for the third Sunday of Easter is always one in which the risen Christ shares food with the disciples, meals that are the Easter template for the meal we share each Sunday. In today's gospel, Jesus both shares the disciples' food and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures, the two main elements of our Sunday worship.

First Reading: Acts 3:12-19 Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-7 Gospel: Luke 24:36b-48

Sunday, April 24 - Fourth Sunday of Easter

The image of the good shepherd shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.

First Reading: Acts 4:5-12 Second Reading: 1 John 3:16-24 Gospel: John 10:11-18

Sunday, April 28 - Fifth Sunday of Easter

This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us is the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

First Reading: Acts 8:26-40 Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-21 Gospel: John 15:1-8

Sunday, May 5 - Sixth Sunday of Easter

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

First Reading: Acts 10:44-48 Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6 Gospel: John 15:9-17 When we commit our lives to community, sabbath, worship, and service, we follow the command of Jesus to love God and love our neighbor. This is what it means to live life to its fullest. Not worried or pre-occupied with our own selves, but looking outward to follow where Jesus leads. Next month, on Sunday, May 5, we have an opportunity during this joyful season of Easter to practice this abundant life together on God's Grace is Amazing Day. We will gather in community for worship, service, and a meal to do God's work together in this community. Thank you to Nancy Backer and Cindy Wohlhuter who are coordinating this special day. There will be indoor and outdoor service projects for all ages and ability levels. I look forward to this Easter-time celebration of what it means to live out our calling to follow our living Lord in love.

Call to Order:

Carolyn Bird called the meeting to order at 11:54 a.m.

Devotional: Troy Nemmers led the devotional on meeting today's problems with God's strength. Live for today.

<u>Gathering Prayer:</u> Council members shared prayer requests, with Pastor Allison concluding with a prayer to address these requests.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

The February 17, 2024 minutes were approved on February 19, 2024 via email.

Financial Report

Jane Reiman, finance director, gave the council an update on the finances of the church. Giving was 17% higher than last year's giving at this same time. As Service Team will meet Tuesday, March 12th, Jane will be sending the financial report via email.

Team Reports

Worship; Josh reported that Worship in the Park will be extended from May 22nd-September 4th, 2024. This will be held at Sylvania Park. Praise Band will continue to be the musicians. He also stated there will be a 3-year rotation for Advent and Lenten services: 1. Dialogue 2. Faith stories from Grace members 3. Pastor devotions. The Joyous Light service will be shared during the Advent evening services while the Holden Service will used during Lent and for all noon services, both Advent and Lent. Worship on the Water on August 11th will have the musicians on land in Wards Park, but boaters are welcome to attend by

water. Pastor Allison is looking for a way to broadcast the service through the radio, similar to our outdoor pandemic services.

<u>CYF</u>: Jaime and Joice reported the CYF team are planning the Palm Sunday Breakfast on Sunday, March 24th. Fairmont Foods donated the eggs and sausage. Confirmation students are donating muffins and working the event. The team will be handing out Grace blankets to our Seniors on Sunday, April 21st at both services, as it is Baccalaureate. Families need to submit the name of their Senior if they want it printed in the bulletin. The team is also planning an End of the BLAST/ Confirmation Year Celebration on Wednesday, May 15th with registration for VBS and next year's BLAST and Confirmation classes taking place. Vacation Bible School will be June 17th-June 20th from 8:00-12:00 noon.

Outreach/Fellowship: Carolyn reported that the team is hosting a food drive in March as it is National Food Shelf Month. 10% of the proceeds will go to Heaven's Table. The rest will stay in the Grace Pantry. The team will be furnishing cookies for the Baccalaureate Service on April 21st. **Service**: Jane reported the Service Team will meet Tuesday, March 12th. She will send the report via email.




