



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What a joyful kick-off to the program year on *God's Work. Our Hands* Sunday. Thank you to everyone who made that day possible, from our teams helping with projects for neighbors around the world, praise and worship, and a delicious meal. In this month of October, where we celebrate the Reformation, Luther's words remind us that while we are not saved by our works, service to our neighbor is one way we live out our faith as disciples of Jesus. It is a privilege to serve with you!



The month of October has us continuing in Luke's gospel where we will hear many beloved stories. These include faith like a mustard seed, Jesus healing people and one healed man's deep and life-changing gratitude to God as a result, the persistent widow and how our prayer lives should be so earnest, and our freedom found in Jesus. As we walk together through these gospel lessons, we will be moving closer to Reformation and Confirmation Sunday on October 26. Our 10th graders will share their favorite Bible verse, recite the Apostles' Creed, and re-affirm their baptism as the congregation continues to pray for these beloved children of God.

Faith formation is a life-long journey as we grow in our understanding of scripture, shaped by the Holy Spirit. Luther wrote, "A Christian is never in a state of completion but always in a process of becoming." Therefore, we are excited this year to offer faith formation from baptism to late adulthood. Our new Baby Bibles class is for infants through aged 2, with their families, and meets monthly on Sunday mornings. BLAST meets on Wednesday evening for ages 3 through 6th grade. And our new high school class meets on Wednesday nights at 7PM in the Lounge, at the same time as confirmation. Adults meet for topical series on Sunday mornings which include casual conversation and prayer. Our topic this month is the life and ministry of Simon Peter, that faithful disciple of Jesus, who doesn't always get it right, but loves Jesus with his whole heart.

It is wonderful to have Wednesdays hopping again with nearly 200 youth for BLAST and Confirmation as well as the entire church invited for Open Door Meal and our mid-week praise worship from 6:30-7PM. Know that there is a place for you here at Grace, to come as you are, ask your questions of faith, wrestle and grow, and have a faith community to walk with you on this journey. Also, be sure and mark your calendars for our Oktoberfest Dinner to celebrate the Reformation on Wednesday, October 22. There will be brats and hotdogs, potato salad, pretzels, root beer, German chocolate cake, and of course, polka music!

We have many opportunities for worship, service, faith formation, and fellowship because of your generosity. From your time coming to worship, organizing and planning on teams, volunteering your time to teach or be a small group leader, singing in one of the choirs, helping with building and grounds projects around the church, knitting prayer shawls, providing financial support through your offering, and so many other ways, Grace continues to teach the good news of Jesus Christ, reaching out of our doors, and being a good neighbor. And as one of your pastors, I can share what a privilege it is to walk with you in life's joys and challenges as well.

Sometimes, those challenges are addressed by dropping by the church, giving us a call, making an appointment, or asking your pastors to call you. We are so glad when you let us know of hospital stays, illnesses, and hospice. At the same time, we realize that the need for pastoral care may occur after business hours, or on Fridays and Saturdays when your pastors are off. When there is a pastoral emergency, please know you can reach us on our church's on-call phone. We will return that call as soon as we are able. Please be sure to put this number on your fridge or in your phone, and it is in the pastors' voicemails at the church.

Circumstances would include accidents, deaths, and hospital emergencies. This number is not to be used for being unable to read or serve on a Sunday morning, wanting access to the church building, or any other kind of business which can be addressed during office hours. 

Grace Lutheran Church Council Meeting September 21, 2025

Call to Order: Motion to call the meeting to order: Co-Chair Chery Brumbaugh at 11:45 AM

Devotion by Pastor Cole: Seasons changes and excitement at church. Seasons of year remind each of us of revolving new transitions.

Sharing Joys and Concerns: Church Council members shared joys and concerns. Pastor Allison gave our opening prayer.

Approval of Meeting Minutes from 8/17/25:

Approval of Financial Report from 8/17/25:

Team Reports: no questions or discussion. Thank you to the teams for their dedicated work.

Old Business: We are awaiting Synod review of our updated constitution. Once received we will review/incorporate these updates in our draft. An update on the process will be included in the November *Ways of Grace*.

New Business:

The Stewardship Campaign kicked off this week at our Wednesday and Sunday worship services. The theme of *Rivers of Living Water* ties into our call to be stewards of God's blessings at our baptism. The campaign will follow a similar approach to last year with bulletin announcements, letters, a pledge card and stewardship resources, and a dedication at our Thanksgiving worship services.

Council members brought forward names of those to be asked to serve on Council that worship regularly, are involved in the ministries of Grace, and work well with others. The names will be prioritized to have a balanced Council of men and women, new and long-term members, and people representing all three worship services as well as a variety of ministries.


Pastor Cole's Report: Pastor Cole noted his completion of one year of service to Grace Lutheran Church. He reported that the senior high group is active and expressed his intention to continue growing the program. Details regarding confirmation were shared. and BLAST forms were reviewed. Confirmation students in grades 7 through 9 will have the opportunity to attend Good Earth Village's Confirmation Camp for half a week next summer. The church received a \$500 Hunger Grant from the Southeastern MN Synod. Additionally, the Pastors are planning a session for families called "Pizza with Pastors" to welcome those new to Grace, interested in learning more, or ready to join the church.

Pastor Allison's Report: Noted member list distribution has gone well. Playground signs made by Rick DeBoer are being installed to encourage safe play. Adult education has 15 attendees. A small group is organized for a monthly grief support group called Cup of Hope, which is open to the community. Pastor is also working with the Stewardship Team on small, medium- and long-term goals for the congregation which includes renting space in our building to generate income to support our ministries. She has also been working with Blake Pothoff and the Service Team on technology updates. The congregation has shared excellent feedback on video projection using the flat screen TV and the hearing assistance devices. The Service Team is moving forward purchasing and installing two sanctuary TV's and getting six hearing assist devices. We thank the congregation for the generous donations received to off-set these costs.



STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Rivers of Living Water: Overflowing Generosity in Faith

One of Jesus' great teaching parables involves a sower who cast seed along the ground. The sower hoped the seeds would sprout, grow, and bear good fruit. Some seeds did just that, producing a great harvest. But others, Jesus said, fell among thorns and, though they began to grow, these good plants were quickly choked out. Jesus said the thorns were "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth" (Matthew 13:22).

In a culture where having "enough" seems to have become a never-ending pursuit, Jesus' parable remains incredibly relevant. Many of us are chasing the American dream in ways that lead to stress, anxiety, and fear—thorns that can rob us of the ability to enjoy the abundant lives of purpose that God intended for us. All of us have struggled with these issues at one time or another. They are important issues that we cannot ignore.



This is why, over the next several weeks, we will be having a stewardship emphasis called *Rivers of Living Water: Overflowing Generosity in Faith.* During this time we will explore what the Bible teaches us about financial management through a series of bulletin inserts, newsletter articles, and resources on our Stewardship Table in the Gathering Space. In John's gospel, Jesus proclaims, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water." (John 7:37-38)

In our baptisms, we were freed from our sin, and raised to new life, through the death and resurrection of Jesus. We were given a life-long call to follow Jesus and the let our life overflow with love for God and one another. As those baptismal waters were placed on our heads, we were given this commandment to bless others as we have been blessed. Giving generously of our gifts, skills, time, attendance, hospitality, and financial support ensures that the life-giving ministries of the church continue.

This month, we will be remembering our baptism in worship and our call to give generously. We invite you to come and hear the promises of God for you and for your neighbor. In November, we will have the opportunity to make personal commitments of our offerings to God through our church in the coming year. We will consecrate these commitments in worship and celebrate the blessings God provides at our Thanksgiving Worship. We hope you will join us in the coming weeks as we look at how we can manage our financial resources and truly experience simplicity, generosity, and joy.

Stepping Up In Faith: Grace is growing and we need to care for and nurture our growth. This Stepping Up in Faith chart shows how just 1-2% increase of your weekly giving will impact our financial future. For less than the cost of a "pumpkin spice latte" you can make a difference for our church and our congregation.

A team who responds to requests submitted from people in need of financial assistance or resources, food assistance, and resources.




TIME TOGETHER


