

Jesus and Food

Many stories in the Bible involve sustenance. It could be the manna in Exodus, the feeding of the 5,000 when Jesus used five barley loaves of bread and two fish, or the walk to Emmaus when Jesus revealed himself in the breaking of the bread to Cleopas and another unnamed disciple. Food just has a way of creating times of fellowship. However, many do not have access to adequate food.



Here are a few facts from Action Against Hunger that encompasses the world:

- We have plenty of food to feed everyone, but at least 733 million still go hungry.
- Hunger is much more complex than a growling tummy.
- Two and a half million children die each year from lack of adequate nutrition.
- About one in 11 people go to bed each night on an empty stomach.

I think about all of this because this month is Minnesota Food Shelf Month. A pantry or food shelf plays one part in assisting with needs around food insecurity and hunger. From Sunday, March 2nd through Sunday, March 30th will be collecting non-perishable food items for Grace's food pantry that gets used weekly, with 10% going to Heaven's Table that supports all of Martin County. With the help of Jesus, let us continue to take steps to feed all our fellow neighbors. Amen.

Lent Begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5!

The season of Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5, with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a season of repentance and self-examination where we see what is not life-giving, ask for God's forgiveness, and turn our lives back around to God. In the sanctuary, you will find a black box which is our Baggage Box. During this season, you are invited to write down any burden, sin, shame, or fear that is weighing you down and holding you back in your life and

relationship with God and one another. On Easter morning, we will burn this box as a symbol of the refining fire of the Holy Spirit, lighting the Christ Candle from these flames. **On Ash Wednesday, we will be joining with our ecumenical partners for a community Noon service held at St. John's United Church of Christ as well as worship at 6:30PM at Grace.** Confirmation students and their mentors are asked to worship together on Wednesdays in Lent as we sing *Unfailing Light* together with a time for discussion, ending at 7:15PM. We will also offer *Holden Evening Prayer* Wednesdays at noon in the chapel. We hope you will come for a time of mid-week reflection, to take a breath, and acknowledge the presence of Christ in our midst.






Have you ever wondered about the Worship Team?



The Worship Team is a collaborative group of our pastors, musicians, and lay people who plan and organize meaningful, thoughtful, hospitable, and welcoming worship for all. Christ will be the focus as we are led in worship by God's Holy Spirit through Word and song, share in the sacraments of the Lord's Supper and Holy Baptism, following the liturgical calendar to honor the seasons of the church year, and mark milestones in one's faith journey including first communion and confirmation. The Worship Team assists the pastors in fulfilling their call to equip the saints for ministry by providing worship as the main gathering and focal point of Grace Lutheran Church and passing along the faith to the next generation through a variety of worship settings and services.

Congregational Care



God calls us to keep our eyes open to opportunities to serve God and our neighbor using the gifts and talents that God has given us. One place to start looking for opportunities is at Grace's Care Table. This will help you to get connected to Grace and its ministries. By the Care Table you will find a large volunteer sign-up board. It covers opportunities to being an usher, lector, sound person, etc. Just sign the sheet and Nicole from the office will contact you.

This month we will highlight some of the Congregational Care Ministries. The Prayer Chain and weekly Prayer meeting is for lifting up in prayer a person or situation to God. Individuals who ask for prayer, are asked if they want to be on a prayer list. If they say yes, it is given to the 30+ people email prayer team, put in the bulletin and each week another prayer team of 12 prays in person for the request. Prayer requests can be given to the office, written on cards in the pews, or to a pastor.

Along with prayer are our prayer shawls and squares. Our knitters have lovingly created these items of comfort and prayed for you while they worked on them. Please feel free to take a prayer shawl or square to someone you know who needs God's love to wrap them up during a challenging time in their lives.

Grace has many food ministries. There is Open Door Meals every Wednesday night during the school year from 4:45-6:15 pm. All are welcome! Another food ministry is our meal ministry. Meals are brought to a person or family during a time of life transition like an injury, grief, a new baby, etc. Meals are brought for a few weeks to bring God's care and nourishment. Grace also has a Food Pantry for all to use. Various food items and personal care items are available. Another ministry of care are the funeral meal servers who serve a meal after a funeral in Fellowship Hall. They provide hospitality for a grieving family. Our grief card writers also connect with next of kin following the death of a loved one multiple times throughout the first year of grief.

To stay in contact with members who may have mobility issues, our care callers reach out by phone and cards once a month to connect with folks. The Visitation Team meets monthly with those who want a visit and communion in their home. If you would like to be connected with one of these lay teams, or receive a call or visit from one of the pastors, please call the office.

If any of these ministries sound exciting to you, sign up on the bulletin board, contact the office or let a pastor know. Let the Holy Spirit guide and direct you to where you can use your gifts and time in service to God and neighbor.

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, March 2 - Last Sunday after Epiphany

Witnesses to the glory of God in the face of Jesus reflect that glory in the world. It was true for Moses. It was doubtless true for Peter, James, and John. We pray that it will be true of all of us who see God's glory in the word and in the supper and who are being "transformed into the same image" by God's Spirit.

Sunday, March 9– First Sunday in Lent

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. The nearness of the Lord, in bread and wine, water and word, will uphold and sustain us.

Gospel: Luke 4:1-13

Sunday, March 16 - Second Sunday in Lent

Though we sometimes doubt and often resist God's desire to protect and save us, our God persists. In holy baptism, God's people have been called and gathered into a God-initiated relationship that will endure. Lent provides the church with a time and a tradition in which to seek God's face again. Lent provides another occasion to behold the God of our salvation in the face of the Blessed One who "comes in the name of the Lord."

Second Reading: Philippians 3:17—4:1

Gospel: Luke 13:31-35

Sunday, March 23- Third Sunday in Lent

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to

attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!

Gospel: Luke 13:1-9

Sunday, March 30 - Fourth Sunday in Lent

The psalm sets the tone this day: "Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!" Happy are those who have "become the righteousness of God" in the merits of Christ Jesus. Happy are those for whom the forgiveness of God has "rolled away . . . the disgrace" of former times. Happy is the father at the return of his prodigal son. Happy are we that our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Rejoice!


