

# Generosity

"A generous person will prosper, whoever refreshes others will be refreshed." Proverbs 11:25

What is generosity? Basically, it is giving freely and abundantly to others. Those others are family, friends, colleagues, neighbors, and even strangers. It is a way of living in the world with others and our

interactions with them. It is how we use our time, talents, energy and money.

The "how" of generosity can take many forms. The following forms are: emotional and relational support, monetary support, hospitality support, gift support, and service and volunteering support. All of these are ways we are giving ourselves to others.

Who is to be generous? Anyone can be a generous person. However, we as Christians are called to be generous people. God has been generous with us with his love and goods. We, too, are to imitate his generosity in the world.

When are we to be generous? When we see a need in a person and/or the community, we are to help address that need. Generosity is a way of life. It is to be practiced on a daily basis with our loved ones and others.

Why be generous? For Christians we are told it is better to give than receive. It is good to give and receive graciously. As the proverb states, generous people will prosper; it feels good to give of ourselves and resources. Yes, it does cost us something, our time, energy, or money. However, the benefits outweigh the cost. One of the fruits of the Holy Spirit is generosity. When we are living by God's will and ways, generosity is expressed.

It is in giving that we receive, this is a big part of Christianity and being a Christian. If we listen to the world, we can be driven by a lack of supply and scarcity. If scarcity is in your world view it will be harder to be generous. However, if we trust in God and his great abundance we are driven towards generosity. God is willing and able to provide for US.

In the book, The Paradox of Generosity, they did research on generous and ungenerous people. What the research shows is that people who regularly practice generosity have a better well-being in life. They are happier, have better bodily health, a purpose in living, avoidance of depression, and interest in personal growth. Consequently, generosity produces a win-win situation for the giver. That is, whatever is given can bring benefits to us. Let us all continue to work to practice all forms of generosity in our homes, community, and the world. It makes a difference in us and for others.

### WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, September 3, 2023 Lectionary 22

The prophet Jeremiah speaks of the incurable wound of his suffering yet finds in God's words the delight of his heart. When Peter doesn't grasp Jesus' words about suffering, Jesus tells the disciples they will find their lives in losing them. Such sacrificial love is described by Paul when he urges us to associate with the lowly and not repay evil with evil. In worship we gather as a community that we might offer ourselves for the sake of our suffering world.

First Reading: Jeremiah 15:15-21 Second Reading: Romans 12:9-21 Gospel: Matthew 16:21-28

**Sunday, September 10, 2023 Lectionary 23** Conflict is a part of relationships and life in community. Jesus' words in today's gospel are often used in situations having to do with church discipline. The prophet Ezekiel tells of warning the wicked to turn from their ways, and Paul reminds us that love is the fulfilling of the law. We gather in the name of Christ, assured that he is present among us with gifts of peace and reconciliation.

First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-11 Second Reading: Romans 13:8-14 Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20

Sunday, September 17, 2023 Lectionary 24 In today's second reading Paul questions why we judge one another, since we all stand before the judgment of God. Yet we do sin against one another, and Jesus' challenge that we forgive seventy-seven times reveals God's boundless mercy. When we hear the words of forgiveness in worship and sign ourselves with the cross, we are renewed in baptism to be signs of reconciliation in the world. First Reading: Genesis 50:15-21 Second Reading: Romans 14:1-12 Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35


Sunday, September 24, 2023 Lectionary 25

Matthew narrates one of Jesus' controversial parables in which Jesus says that the reign of God is like that of a landowner who pays his workers the same wage no matter what time of day they began to work. When God changes God's mind about punishing Nineveh for their evil ways, Jonah is angry. Yet God is gracious and merciful, abounding in steadfast love. In baptism we receive the grace of God that is freely given to all. As Martin Luther wrote, in the presence of God's mercy we are all beggars.




