Welcome, Pastor Cheryl Indehar!

Dear Grace members.

All ELCA pastors are called to various ministries, including interim ministry. For the past ten years, I have been an interim minister in SEMN Synod. There are many different congregations that I have had the opportunity to serve – both large and small – within the synod. I am honored to be invited to serve as Interim Associate Pastor at Grace Lutheran Church in Fairmont.

A little background information about me might be helpful. St. Paul is where I was born, raised, educated, and worked. My father was a school

social worker and my mother was a traditional housewife. I grew up with three brothers – two older and one younger. As a single person with no

children, I am blessed to have seven nieces and nephews, twelve great-nieces and nephews, and two great-great nieces and nephews. The role of "Auntie Cheryl" is one that I have thoroughly relished over the years.

I am a career person. My first career was in law enforcement working as a police officer, then sergeant, for the St. Paul Police Department. Among my eight work assignments over 29 years in the department included patrol, investigation, and administration. While working full-time, I attended Luther Seminary part-time, and it took seven years to complete my Master of Divinity degree. People ask how did I pick these careers? My response is that I didn't pick them, God did. I have tried to be faithful to all the calls and opportunities that God has given me.

On January 19, 2002, I was ordained as an ELCA pastor of word and sacrament. My first call was in St. Paul as a pastor, on a part-time basis, as I continued to work full-time for the police department. Those were some hectic years, and I retired from law enforcement in August 2006.

One of my areas of interest is travel. I have been to Israel, Thailand, India and Tanzania. In the summer of 2009, I took my first trip to Tanzania with a church group from St. Paul Synod. The next spring, I went back to Tanzania and taught theology classes at the University in Iringa for 10 weeks. In 2019, I went again with a group from SEMN Synod to visit our Synodical partners in Tanzania. It is a beautiful country filled with wonderful people. Lately, I have travelled to Hawaii, Florida, New York City and San Francisco. I also like to read, watch movies, cheer for the MN Vikings and MN Wild teams.

I am so looking forward to working with you all as we do God's ministry in this world. Thank you for this wonderful opportunity!

Take this Bread: Bread for our Neighbors! Please bake three mini loaves in place of the one 9x5 loaf called for in the recipe.

Cool and wrap loaves in saran wrap, leaving them in their foil pan.

Return loaves on God's Grace is Amazing Day, Sunday May 7, by 9AM in the fellowship hall. No nuts please! Thank you!!!

NOTE: Prepare as directed but use 3 mini loaf pans instead of 1 regular pan. Cook time will vary - approximately 30-40 minutes.

Ingredients:

- 1 1/3 cups white sugar, divided
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175

- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1 cup milk
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil

Directions:

degrees C). Lightly grease a 9x5-inch loaf pan.

Mix together 1/3 cup sugar and 2 teaspoons cinnamon in a small bowl; set aside.

Combine flour, remaining 1 cup sugar, baking powder, and salt together in a large bowl. Combine egg, milk, and oil in a separate bowl; add to flour

Pour 1/2 of the batter into the prepared pan. Sprinkle with 1/2 of the reserved cinnamon-sugar mixture. Repeat with remaining batter and cinnamon-sugar mixture. Draw a knife through batter to marble. Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center of the loaf comes out clean, 45 to 50

Let cool completely. Wrap in plastic wrap before returning to church the following day, Sunday May 7.

The March Grace Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes will be included in the June issue of Ways of Grace.

Pastor's Report from Pastor Cheryl:

On April 2, 2023 I was blessed to start my ministry at Grace Lutheran Church. It was a great time to start and be here for Holy Week. I was able to preside at all the services. There were some meetings with Pastor Allison to work out details of each service. I am planning to provide worship at Goldfinch on April 12, 2023, as well as preach Wednesday evening service. I will be preaching on April 16 and 23, 2023.

Pastor Allison and I had a meeting with Deacon about the members that have been visited and those needed to be visited. There are many members who are not able to make it to worship. It was discussed that a Call Care Team be established to try and reach out to everyone. Deacon will be on the Visitation Team and continue to visit some members. I am planning on organizing the list and meeting with the visitation team that meets quarterly.

Besides weekly staff meetings, I am also, planning on attending Church Council, Worship, Youth and Outreach/Fellowship Committees. The SEMN Synod has monthly meetings for Interim Pastors that I attend by zoom and monthly Conference meetings with rostered and lay leaders.

This year for continuing education I am planning on taking classes from the Lombard Mennonite Peace Center. So far, I have already taken the following classes from them: Healthy Congregations; Fractured Lives, Fractured Churches, Healing the Breach, and Conflict Transformation Skills for Churches. This summer I will be taking Mediation Skills Training Institute and this fall Restorative Conversations. I have already taken one class from Dialogue Works on change in churches and will take the last class Ending with Grace. This is the last class of four to teach and work with small rural congregations facing change.

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, May 7th - Fifth Sunday of Easter

As we continue to celebrate the fifty days of Easter, today's gospel includes Jesus' promise that he goes to prepare a place for his followers in his Father's house. Our baptism commissions us to share Jesus' mission in the world. As 1 Peter reminds us, we are a holy people, called to proclaim the one who called us out of darkness into light. In words and deeds we bear witness to the risen Christ—our way, our truth, our life.

First Reading: Acts 7:55-60 Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:2-10

Gospel: John 14:1-14

Sunday, May 14th - Sixth Sunday of Easter,

Jesus does not abandon his followers. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus comes to abide with his disciples of every generation. As Pentecost draws near, we are reminded that the risen Christ dwells in us as the Spirit of truth. We receive this Spirit in baptism and pray that in our gathering around the Lord's table the Spirit will transform us to be the body of the risen Christ in the world.

First Reading: Acts 17:22-31 Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:13-22

Gospel: John 14:15-21

Sunday, May 21, 2023 - Seventh Sunday of Easter

In these days between Ascension and Pentecost, we gather with the disciples in the upper room, waiting for the Spirit to transform the church around the world. In today's gospel Jesus prays for his followers and for their mission in his name. Amid religious, social, and economic divisions, we seek the unity that Jesus had with his Father. Made one in baptism, we go forth to live our faith in the world, eager for the unity that God intends for the whole human family.

First Reading: Acts 1:6-14

Second Reading: 1 Peter 4:12-14; 5:6-11

Gospel: John 17:1-11

Sunday, May 28, 2023 - Day of Pentecost

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's

presence within and among us. In Acts the Spirit arrives in rushing wind and flame, bringing God's presence to all people. Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we too are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world.

First Reading: Acts 2:1-21

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-13

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Sunday, June 4, 2023 - The Holy Trinity


Though the word *trinity* is not found in the scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.


