## WORDS FOR WORSHIP

#### Sunday, September 1 - Pentecost 15

Jesus protests against human customs being given the weight of divine law, while the essence of God's law is ignored. True uncleanness comes not from external things, but from the intentions of the human heart. Last week Jesus told us "the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life" John 6:63). Now James says God has given us birth by the word of truth. We who were washed in the word when we were born in the font return to it every Sunday to ask God to create in us clean hearts.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9 Second Reading: James 1:17-27 Gospel: Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

#### Sunday, September 8 - Pentecost 16

James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the assembly, treating the rich visitor with more honor than the poor one. Jesus himself seems to show partiality in his first response to the Syrophoenician woman in today's gospel. Was he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't deserve the goods meant for God's children? Or was he speaking out of his human worldview, but transcended those limits when she took him by surprise with her reply? Either way, the story tells us that God shows no partiality. Everyone who brings a need to Jesus is received with equal honor as a child and heir.

First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7a Second Reading: James 2:1-10 [11-13] 14-17 Gospel: Mark 7:24-37

#### Sunday, September 15 - Pentecost 17

Three weeks ago we heard Peter's confession of faith as told in John's gospel. This week we hear Mark's version, when Peter says, "You are the Messiah." In John, the stumbling block is Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh, given for the life of the world. In Mark too the scandal has to do with Jesus' words about his own coming death, and here Peter himself stumbles over Jesus' words. But Jesus is anointed (the meaning of messiah) in Mark only on the way to the cross (14:3); so we are anointed in baptism with the sign of the cross. First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-9a Second Reading: James 3:1-12 Gospel: Mark 8:27-38

#### Sunday, September 18 - Pentecost 18


Today we hear James warn against selfish ambition, while the disciples quarrel over which one of them is the greatest. Jesus tells them the way to be great is to serve. Then, to make it concrete, he puts in front of them a flesh-andblood child. We are called to welcome the children God puts in front of us, to make room for them in daily interaction, and to give them a place of honor in the assembly.

First Reading: Jeremiah 11:18-20 Second Reading: James 3:13—4:3, 7-8a Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

#### Sunday, September 29 - Pentecost 19

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.

First Reading: Numbers 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29 Second Reading: James 5:13-20 Gospel: Mark 9:38-50

#### **Grace Lutheran Church Congregational Special Meeting Minutes - August 4, 2024**

#### Call to Order:

The special congregational meeting was called to order at 10:48 a.m. by council co-president, Carolyn Bird.

#### Quorum:

94 members were present and signed in. A quorum was met.

#### Presentation of the Candidate:

Cindy Wohlhuter, a call committee member, presented the pastoral candidate, Pastor Cole McCormick. Cindy gave an explanation of the call process and a brief biography of Pastor McCormick. Each call committee member and Pastor Allison then gave strengths of Pastor McCormick. The strengths were the following: communication skills, outreach abilities, youth ministry experience, and his love of Jesus and wanting to share it with all people. Cindy Wohlhuter asked the congregation to vote yes to accept Pastor Cole McCormick as an Associate Pastor of Youth and Outreach. The floor was then opened to questions and comments.

A ballot vote of the members present was then taken. The results of the vote were 93 yes and 1 absentia.

#### Additional Comments

Pastor Allison gave an explanation of the next steps in the process, relating that we can expect Pastor McCormick to begin his call on September 29, 2024. She also stated Pastor Cheryl Indehar will complete her interim position on September 15, 2024, with a farewell appreciation celebration for her service at Grace. A big thank you was given to the call committee for their hard work, time, and due diligence in finding an associate pastor.

The special congregational meeting was adjourned at 11:16.


#### Our \$5 Challenge wrapped up last month and brought in a total of \$5,446!


