### THE PASTOR'S PEN

### SENIOR PASTOR, REV. DR. ALLISON COBB

Jesus said, "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

After the tomb was empty, Jesus spent time making himself known to his disciples and solidifying in their hearts and minds that all of his promises to them were true. He had defeated death, there was forgiveness for all and new life after the grave, and his disciples were charged with sharing this good news with the entire world. Not a small task, but a task they did not have to embark on alone.

In the first chapter of Acts, right before Jesus ascends into heaven, he reminds the disciples of what he shared with him at the last supper. The gift of the Holy Spirit would be given to

them, so they were never without a friend and guide. The very person of God would be with them as they went about their earthly lives until they were reunited with Jesus once again. This day had come for the disciples and they were do use their time left on earth to witness to the unbelievable grace of God's love.

The disciples rushed back to Jerusalem and spent time with Mary, Jesus's mother, and his brothers, and other women disciples, along with the eleven who are usually named, and they pray. They care for one another. And they spend their lives doing the ministry of inclusion, healing, and witnessing that Jesus taught them to do. This small community of believers was not as massive as their former congregation of Jews that many had been a part of. But their numbers increased daily as the Spirit led them to witness to God's love in their everyday lives as trades people, soldiers, mothers and fathers, and so many others woven into the fabric of society.

Scholars have noted that one of the main reasons Christianity spread was that others in the Roman occupied areas in which they lived noticed something special about these followers of Jesus. They cared not just for their own but also people who were strangers, who were ill or begging on the street, and for whom others did not even notice. This care and inclusion was so enticing to others that they began to ask why these Christians lived their lives this way, to which they could then share about Jesus and the impact he has had on their lives.

Fast forward to Grace Lutheran today. Grace, like most mainline Protestant churches, does not have the same numbers as it did in the 1950's, especially after these past few years of the pandemic. But what Grace has is the Holy Spirit at work in our midst. Our community at Grace will grow as we continue to care for not just our own members but also the greater community around us. The "yellow shirt people" will be known for taking care of our parks, the stranger who comes in needing a care bag of basic essentials, the person passing through town on a Wednesday who has a hot meal in our fellowship hall, the shut-in who can no longer get to church but is visited by our homebound communion ministers who remind them that they are not forgotten, for the children in the neighborhood who are welcomed to Bible school this summer, and so much more.

Grace is rolling out a new Meal Ministry this Spring which is being coordinated by Nancy Backer. We are looking to get a list of people who can be emailed when someone is in need of a few meals. If you would like to be on this list, please sign up on the bulletin board. Perhaps someone has a surgery, a new baby, is grieving the death of a loved one, or is undergoing chemo. A meal and a friendly face to deliver it can mean the world! This type of hospitality is just one of the many ways Grace is sharing God's love!

As I close this note, a sincere thank you to all of the ways you show up as the body of Christ here at Grace. And as our program year pauses with the summer, please be sure to try our Wednesday community worship in the park which will have not just Grace pastors, but other pastors and lay leaders from Fairmont. Invite any kids you know to VBS, worship on the water is coming in August, and so many other opportunities for us to be church together. For those who will take a trip this summer, be sure to bring back your bulletin from wherever you attend church. I would love to hear what you enjoyed at that church!





### **WORDS FOR WORSHIP**

### Sunday, June 4, 2023 - The Holy Trinity

Though the word *trinity* is not found in the scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

First Reading: Genesis 1:1--2:4a Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

### Sunday, June 4, 2023 - Lectionary 10

Though Jesus was a devout Jew who practiced his faith, he was criticized for eating with tax collectors and sinners—the religiously nonobservant. Jesus criticizes the self-righteous and reminds us that mercy is to be at the heart of our religious practices. God continues to be made known in those on the margins of society, like Matthew the tax collector and the hemorrhaging woman. As we gather each Lord's day we receive the healing that makes us well and sends us forth to be signs of God's mercy for the world.

First Reading: Hosea 5:15--6:6 Second Reading: Romans 4:13-25 Gospel: Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

### Sunday, June 18, 2023 - Lectionary 11

Moses tells the Israelites that they are called to be a priestly kingdom and a holy people. Jesus sends out the disciples as laborers into the harvest. In baptism we too are anointed for ministry, sharing God's compassion with our needy world. From the Lord's table we go forth to proclaim the good news, to heal the sick, and to share our bread with the hungry.

First Reading: Exodus 19:2-8a Second Reading: Romans 5:1-8 Gospel: Matthew 9:35—10:8 [9-23]

### Sunday, June 25, 2023 - Lectionary 12

God does not promise that the path of the disciple will be easy. Jeremiah feels the pain of rejection from those who do not want to hear what he has to say. Jesus declares that his words may bring stark division. Even so, we need not be afraid for God accounts for each hair on our heads. Though we may experience rejection, frustration, division, and death, God's grace and love make us a new creation each day. Marked with the cross and filled with holy food, we are sent from worship to witness to Christ in the

### Grace Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - March 19, 2023

Present: Pete Odgren, Joice Foster, Ilene Reiter, Patti Mathews, Joshua Ensrud, Carolyn Bird, Kris Boerner, Ardell Prescott, Jane Reiman, Pastor Allison Cobb, Pastor Cheryl

Not Present: Troy Nemmers

<u>Call to Order</u>: Pete Odgren called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm.

Devotional: Given today by Ilene Reiter.

### Financial Report:

Jane Reiman gave the March 2023 Financial Report. She reported March giving was at \$29,500, down 43% from March 2022. The council discussed that the staffing model may need to change to reflect the reduction in giving. A motion to approve the April 16th, 2023 Financial Report was made by Carolyn Bird Ardell seconded the motion. The Financial Report was approved by the rest of the council members.

### Team Reports

Last day of B.L.A.S.T. is May 10th, 2023. VBS will be held Mon. June 12th-Thurs. June 15th with the Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp at Grace Lutheran Church from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. The council discussed student participants bringing a sack lunch with them each day they are at VBS. The church will provide a backup lunch for students who do not bring lunch. Lodging still needs to be set up for camp leadership. Graduation Recognition is Sun. April 30th at 10:45 a.m. The summer mission trip is July 15th-July 22nd, 2023. A female chaperone still needs to be found to go on the trip. The chaperones will be driving the van to the scheduled destinations throughout the trip. With an opening in the Church education position, duties will be divided amongst the CYF committee lay members. Council discussed changing the CYF position from 30 hrs. to 15 hrs. This is due to the current financial figures. The council said they will create a more formal duty and schedule outline to be implemented in the Fall.

### Worship:

Worship in the park will start June 7th and end August 31st, 2023. Grace Lutheran Church has partnered with other churches in the community to provide worship services. The council discussed improving communication with marketing this worship service.

### Outreach:

Patti Mathews is encouraging Outreach to get involved in promoting Worship in the park with various ways of advertising. She is trying to schedule various food trucks to be at the worship services as well to help draw in more people. O Scoops will charge \$400 for 100 small servings of ice cream.

### Service:

Jane Reiman stated that the current Insurance company will be increasing their insurance premium 43% as they are getting away from insuring churches. Jane and the service team are currently in the process of getting 2 quotes. They have received one already. The premium is close to what the church is already paying. Plus, there will be additional items that will be insured under the 1st quote. The Service team is waiting on the second quote before making their final decision.

E. Fellowship: Same as Outreach

#### Personnel:

Looking for a volunteer to fill an open position on the Personnel committee.

### VII. Old Business

Technical Personnel Position: Will be reopening the position. The council discussed various ideas to make the position less complicated: using new user friendly software to tape and post services online, etc.

B. Stained Glass Window Project: Moving forward with a 2 year plan to complete the West and North wall windows. The council decided it will not use money from the trust account, but will use additional money from other sources within the financials as they would like that money saved for any emergency projects that come up during the fiscal year.

### BUSINESS OF GRACE CONTINUED...

C. Fundraising Projects: A Culligan jug will be positioned in the church for the congregation to donate coins in for the project "People Helping People". An announcement will be placed in the next worship service bulletin for another project "God's Grace is Amazing Day".

Core Values: The council discussed and decided to schedule a separate meeting in July to create a core values mission statement. The reason the council chose to schedule a separate meeting for this topic was so they could dedicate the time needed to complete this task.

### VIII. New Business

**Christian Education Director Position:** The council decided to wait until after Service Teams' next meeting. As that team will be finalizing the plan to move forward with this position.

### B. Church Covenant

Pastor Cheryl presented the council team with an example of a covenant for the council team to review. The council plans to vote on the covenant during their meeting in July.

### Pastor Reports

Pastor Cheryl: She stated she has felt welcomed by the congregation both inside and outside of church.

Pastor Allison: She stated that the Wednesdays schedule will stay the same but with a few tweaks: Open Door Meals will be 4:45-6:30 p.m. This is a change from the 6:15 p.m. end time. B.L.A.S.T will be from 5:30-6:30 p.m. Wednesday Worship Service will start at 6:30 p.m. Confirmation will be from 7:00 -8:00 p.m. and be held in the Fellowship Hall

This schedule was created to both capitalize on the number of kids attending church school, to attempt to make it easier for children and their families to worship together, and provide structure in the confirmation program.




