

Kindness and Gentleness

Kindness and gentleness are two of the fruits of the Holy Spirit and they go together. Kindness by definition is having a good or benevolent nature or disposition. Words that are similar to kindness are humane, tender and compassionate. Gentleness by definition means being amiable, kind, and mild. The opposite of kindness and gentleness is cruel and harsh.



When we are living by the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we are

experiencing kindness and gentleness. Kindness is a disposition towards each other. It is giving another person respect, dignity and consideration of our time and energy. It is giving compassionate towards that person. It is how we treat that other person.

Call to Order:

Carolyn Bird called the meeting to order at 10:40 a.m.

Devotional: Joice led the devotional on the importance of looking for ways and celebrating the Holy Spirit moving through the church.

<u>Gathering Prayer:</u> Council members shared prayer requests, with Pastor Allison concluding with a prayer to address these requests.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

The May 19, 2024 minutes were approved on May 19, 2024 via email.

Financial Report

Jane Reiman, finance director, gave the council an update on the finances of the church. Giving was 16% higher than last year's giving at this same time. \$4,100 has been given thus far in the \$5 challenge campaign. The campaign continues through August with the goal of \$10,000 being raised. A motion was made by

approve the financial report. Seconded by Joyce. Motion carried.

Team Reports

The CYF and Outreach and Fellowship teams' minutes were received and reviewed by the Council. The CYF team was busy organizing Vacation Bible School to be held June 17-20th. Thus far, 75 students have registered. Also, the team was rejoicing in more members joining the CYF team. The Outreach and Fellowship team was planning food and meals for various summer activities at Grace. The Personnel Team will be meeting with Kathy Roalson to discuss details of the Open Door Coordinator position. They will then be seeking applicants for this position as Kathy has resigned. Service and Stewardship Teams will meet next week and will send out minutes to council members.

Old Business

The Council met via Zoom with Pastor Kristi Mitchell from the ELCA Southeastern Minnesota Synod to guide them through the process of updating Grace Lutheran Church constitution and bylaws, as it has not been done since 2012. Pastor Kristi gave much valuable information and insight into this process and the timelines that need to be met. The council agreed this will take a considerable amount of time and plan to have it ready for approval by the congregation at the January 2026 annual meeting. Troy volunteered to merge the Grace Lutheran constitution and the ELCA Model Constitution. The constitution sub-committee of Carolyn, Kris, Josh, Pastor Allison, and Pastor Cheryl will be working on looking at the constitution in more depth once the merge has been completed. The full council will have a work session in August to prepare a time-line task chart and work on updating the Constitution.

New Business

The Council discussed the webinar that they viewed entitled "Burden Or Blessing to Use Your Property", which discussed ways the church

building can be used to produce income. The Stewardship Team will be exploring this idea more at upcoming meetings.

Fairmont Opera House has asked Grace to house their baby grand piano for a while during the time the Opera House is out of commission and seeking funds for construction remodeling costs. The Mankato Symphony may be performing once again at Grace on March 16, 2025 and will need a baby grand piano. Grace may utilize the piano while it is here. Troy moved to allow the baby grand piano to be housed at Grace. Mark seconded it. Motion carried.

A discussion took place concerning Brad Anderson, our custodian, getting his boilers license. Brad is willing to go through the process. Troy moved to pay up to 2 tests, as well as travel expenses and meals, for Brad to do so. Brandon seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor Report

Pastor Allison and Pastor Cheryl sent written reports on the work they have accomplished the past month. The Council appreciates all the work they are doing here at Grace.



FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT FOR MAY






CHILDREN, YOUTH, & FAMILY

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, July 7 - Lectionary 14

Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority over demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it all must be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them. When we are sent from the assembly to witness and to heal, we are asked to be vulnerable, to be dependent on the reception of others. The Spirit always operates in the "between": between Jesus and his Abba, between Jesus and us, between you and me, between us and those to whom we are sent.

First Reading: Ezekiel 2:1-5 Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 12:2-10 Gospel: Mark 6:1-13

Sunday, July 14 - Lectionary 15

When Amos reports his vision of God judging Israel for its mistreatment of the poor, he becomes a threat to the power of the priests and the king. John the Baptist also speaks truth to power, and Herod has him killed. In Herod's fear that Jesus is John returned from the dead, we may hear hope for the oppressed: all the prophets killed through the ages are alive in Jesus. We are called to witness to justice in company with them, and to proclaim God's saving love.

First Reading: Amos 7:7-15 Second Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14 Gospel: Mark 6:14-29

Sunday, July 21 - Lectionary 16

Mark's gospel makes clear how great is the press of the crowd, with its countless needs to be met, on Jesus and his disciples. Yet in today's gospel Jesus advises his disciples to get away and rest, to take care of themselves. Sometimes we think that when others are in great need we shouldn't think of ourselves at all; but Jesus also honors the caregivers' need. We are sent from Christ's table to care for others and for ourselves. First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6 Second Reading: Ephesians 2:11-22 Gospel: Mark 6:30-34, 53-56

Sunday, July 28 - Lectionary 17

Today is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. What we have, what we bring to Jesus' table, seems like it is not nearly enough to meet all the needs we see around us. But it is not the adequacy of our supplies or our skills that finally makes the difference: it is the power of Jesus working in the littlest and least to transform this world into the world God desires, a world where all the hungry are satisfied.

First Reading: 2 Kings 4:42-44 Second Reading: Ephesians 3:14-21 Gospel: John 6:1-21

Sunday, August 4 - Lectionary 18

Apparently not satisfied by Jesus' feeding of thousands, some who were there press him for a sign of his power; perhaps it is daily manna they want. As always in John's gospel when people want a sign, Jesus offers himself. He is the bread come from heaven to give life to the world. He calls us to come to him and believe in him, and through that relationship to know the one who sent him.


