An Attitude of Service

Thank you for all the kind hospitality these first few weeks and if I have not been able to meet you yet, I look forward to doing so.

Jesus said, "For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many." Mark 10:45

This was part of our Gospel story in worship a few weeks ago. I love this word serve because it continues to mean ways that we can explore outside of ourselves. Often, we might be looking to be part of endeavors that we enjoy and are passionate about. Don't get me wrong, enjoying something and being passionate about something are all significant parts of life, but what does it also mean to continue to be of service to our neighbors. It might mean putting passion and enjoying something on the back burners because something in the larger picture is potentially where Christ might be leading us. Ways that we can continue to support our neighbors and assist our neighbors in directions that will help them to flourish. Neighbors locally, neighbors close by, or neighbors that live in another country. I think about the following words as we continue to journey through this daily invitation:

S – SURPRISE – Do something meaningful for someone that is totally unexpected and unplanned? Do the dishes at home if you don't normally do them, pay for the car behind you as you go through a local drive-thru or call somebody that you always text.

E – EXPLORE – Be open to trying something new and the gentle nudging of the Spirit to do something outside of your normal comfort zone. Maybe it is introducing yourself to somebody that you don't know if you are not much of a people person or trying that activity that you have been curious about.

R – REFLECT – What are some ways that you have already assisted your fellow neighbors in the body of Christ this calendar year? Have you been a listening ear for someone, did you share some words of comfort, or did you drive them to an appointment.

V- VIGILANT – Be alert to the current needs of the community and around the world. What is happening around food insecurity, housing, transportation, mental health, medical care, etc.

E- EXEMPLIFY – Be a Christ like example for someone else. Martin Luther, the theologian and reformer of the Lutheran church has talked about being a "little Christ to one another."

Because service comes to mind as Thanksgiving approaches, as this church year continues to be on the home stretch and as a new church year will soon begin. We are people that have an attitude of serving, we are called to be people of service and what amazing opportunity's Christ continues to reveal to all of us.

Call to Order: Co-President Carolyn Bird called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

Devotional: Kris led the devotional on attitude and gratitude.

<u>Gathering Prayer</u>: Council members shared prayer requests, with Pastor Allison concluding with a prayer to address these requests.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

The September minutes were approved on September 18, 2024 via email.

Financial Report

Jane Reiman, finance director, gave the council an update on the finances of the church. Giving was up 5.6% over last year at this same time. The giving patterns of the congregation was discussed. The stewardship drive is in full swing. Jane also reminded that all team budgets for 2025 are due to her by November 1st. A motion was made by Mark to approve the financial report. Seconded by Kris.

Motion carried.

Team Reports

All team reports were sent via email for the council to read as time was needed for working on the Grace Lutheran Constitution update. A concern about when the screens would be working again for the contemporary service was addressed. They should be up and running soon. A concern about the location of the Wednesday night service was discussed. It was decided to keep it in the chapel for the time being.





Old Business

The council discussed signage for doors after the decision was made to have only 2 doors open, the front and back entrances, for security and safety reasons. Pastor Allison will look into getting welcoming signs made with directives to use the front and back entrance doors.

The council continued the work of updating the Grace Lutheran Church Constitution since it hasn't been done since 2012. The council was able to get through Chapter 14. It is the hopes of the council to have the updated version ready for congregation approval by the January 2026 annual meeting, as there are many steps that must be taken and timelines to follow before a congregational vote.

New Business

The council discussed possible members to serve on church council starting in January 2025. There are four positions that need to be filled. The pastors and co-presidents will be contacting members.

Pastor Allison suggested we secure Pastor Emily from the Southeastern Minnesota Synod, ECLA to lead the 2025 church council retreat in February. Our main focus would be stewardship. The council agreed.

Pastor Report

Pastor Allison and Pastor Cole sent written reports on the work they have accomplished the past month. The council continues to be thankful for our ministers and all the work they are doing.

+Funeral Meal Servers:


Help to provide hospitality while serving meals during Funerals at Grace.

+Care Bags:


This team assembles bags with essential items provided for visitors in need.




STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity!

One of Jesus' great teaching parables involves a sower who cast seed along the ground. The sower hoped the seeds would sprout, grow, and bear good fruit. Some seeds did just that, producing a great harvest. But others, Jesus said, fell among thorns and, though they began to grow, these good plants were quickly choked out. Jesus said the thorns were "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth" (Matthew 13:22).

In a culture where having "enough" seems to have become a never-ending pursuit, Jesus' parable remains incredibly relevant. Many of us are chasing the American dream in ways that lead to stress, anxiety, and fear—thorns that can rob us of the ability to enjoy the abundant lives of purpose that God intended for us.



All of us have struggled with these issues at one time or another. They are important issues that we cannot ignore. This is why, our stewardship emphasis is called *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity.* During this time we will explore what the Bible teaches us about financial management through a series of bulletin inserts, newsletter articled, and resources on our Stewardship Table in the Gathering Space.

This month, we will have the opportunity to make personal commitments of our offerings to God through our church in the coming year. We will consecrate these commitments in worship and celebrate the blessings God provides at our Thanksgiving Worship. 

Homes for Homeless Snowmen Sale






The Miracles of Jesus!

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, November 3 - ALL SAINTS DAY Jesus states the core of God's law: love God with all you are and have, and love your neighbor as yourself. The scribe agrees that Jesus has rightly identified the most important commandments, much more important than sacrifices. It's easy for us to say with the writer of the letter to the Hebrews that sacrifices aren't needed anymore, but harder to acknowledge that all our worship, all our community service, all our social action, all our family caregiving is worthless if it is done without love.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:1-9 Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-14 Gospel: Mark 12:28-34

Sunday, November 10 - Pentecost 25

Widows are visible everywhere in today's readings. Jesus denounces those scribes who pray impressive prayers but devour widows' houses. He commends the poor widow who in his view gave far more than the major donors. Jesus doesn't see her simply as an object of compassion or charity. She, like the widow of Zarephath who shares her last bit of food with Elijah, does something of great importance.

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:8-16 Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28 Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Sunday, November 17 - Pentecost 26

November begins with All Saints Day and ends in or near Advent, when we anticipate Christ's coming again. It is fitting, then, that the readings today tell of the final resurrection and the end time. In the turmoil of hope, fear, and disbelief that these predictions provoke in us, Hebrews sounds a note of confident trust. Christ makes a way for us where there is no way, and we walk it confidently, our hearts and bodies washed in baptismal water, trusting the one who has promised forgiveness. The more we see the last day approaching, the more important it is to meet together to provoke one another to love.

First Reading: Daniel 12:1-3 Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14 [15-18] 19-25 Gospel: Mark 13:1-8

Sunday, November 24 - Pentecost 27

Even after Israel had experienced the vagaries of kings, the people still longed for a true king to set things right. He would have the king's title of Anointed One (Messiah); he would be the "one like a human being" (Son of Man) given dominion in Daniel's vision. Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love.
