"Rejoice"

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard you hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:4-7



Rejoice is a word that is not used very often today, but in the Bible rejoice is used

175 times. The dictionary describes the word rejoice as to be glad, to take delight and/or to make joyful. It is something we are to experience. Joy, by definition, is the emotions of great delight or happiness caused by something good or satisfying; a source of keen pleasure or delight; the expression of display or display of glad feelings; a state of happiness; to feel joy.

Paul writes this letter from prison to the Philippians. He is suffering but speaks of joy throughout this letter. What is bringing this joy is Jesus Christ. Paul's identity is tied to Jesus who is his savior and Lord. Paul who first persecuted the Christians, is now one and is being persecuted. He doesn't let his joy in the Lord be taken away from him because of his circumstances. He maintains his rejoicing in Jesus. When he is rejoicing in Jesus, he is joyful.

Paul states that the Lord is near. In a way that we cannot understand, Jesus has the ability to be near us. In another letter 1 Corinthians, Paul calls God's temple and that God's Spirit, the Holy Spirit, lives and dwells inside of us. God is always close to us and is approachable. This all brings joy to Paul and allows him to rejoice.

One of the main things that can take our joy and rejoicing from us is worrying. Paul addresses that in this text. He boldly states, "Do not worry about anything." If we worry about something, we are told to lift up our requests in prayer and supplication to God in thanksgiving. We give to God our concerns because He is the one who can do something with them.

When we give our worries to God, we will receive the peace of God. This peace surpasses all our understanding. This peace will also guard your hearts and mind in Christ Jesus. God wants us to live in His peace, as well as, His love and joy. That is what he intends for us all the time.

Paul called the Philippians and us to be gentle so it is known to everyone. In Galatians, Paul talks about the fruit of the Holy Spirit. When we are led by the Spirit, we experience the fruits of the Spirit. These fruits are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, and self-control. When we are led by the Spirit we look to living God's ways and thinking of what God desires.

We, as Christians, are to live joyful lives and rejoice in the Lord always. This text tells us how to do it. Like Paul, our identity is in Christ. We have been claimed by God as his beloved children. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross forgives our sins and gives us eternal life. God's peace protects and guards our hearts and minds to focus on Christ. All of these are gifts from God. We can give thanks with a grateful heart for all that God has done for us.

WORDS FOR WORSHIP

Sunday, January 7 - Epiphany

The feast of Epiphany ("manifestation") concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. In Isaiah and Ephesians, that glory is proclaimed for all nations and people. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God's love to all people.

First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6 Second Reading: Ephesians 3:1-12 Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

Sunday, January 14 - Second Sunday after Epiphany All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just pastors and deacons but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where-or rather whom-we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called

"the house of God, and ... the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

First Reading: 1 Samuel 3:1-10 [11-20] Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 Gospel: John 1:43-51

Sunday, January 21 - Third Sunday after Epiphany Our re-creation in baptism is an image of the Genesis creation, where the Spirit of God moved over the waters. Both Mark's gospel and the story in Acts make clear that it is the Spirit's movement that distinguishes Jesus' baptism from John's. The Spirit has come upon us as upon Jesus and the Ephesians, calling us God's beloved children and setting us on Jesus' mission to re-create the world in the image of God's vision of justice and peace.

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Gospel: Mark 1:14-20

Sunday, January 28 - Fourth Sunday after Epiphany

In Deuteronomy God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses, who will speak for God; in Psalm 111 God shows the people the power of God's works. For the church these are ways of pointing to the unique authority people sensed in Jesus' actions and words. We encounter that authority in God's word, around which we gather, the word that prevails over any lesser spirit that would claim power over us, freeing us to follow Jesus.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 8:1-13 Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

Sunday, February 4 - Fifth Sunday after Epiphany In Isaiah the one God who sits above the earth and numbers the stars also strengthens the powerless. So in Jesus' healing work we see the hand of the creator God, lifting up the sick woman to health and service (*diakonia*). Like Simon's mother-in-law, we are lifted up and healed to serve. Following Jesus, we strengthen the powerless; like Jesus, we seek to renew our own strength in quiet times of prayer.

First Reading: Isaiah 40:21-31 Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23 Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

October 15, 2023

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Council President, Pete Odgren.

Devotional: Carolyn shared a devotional titled "Uniquely Made" from David Jeramiah Ministries. Approval of Meeting Minutes of September was done online.

Financial Report

Jane Reiman reviewed the financial reports. We have an estimated negative balance of \$10,000. We are making strides. However, we haven't paid any to the synod at this time. It was discussed having a temple talk first week of November regarding the finances of the church.

The financial report was approved by Carolyn Bird and seconded by Kris Boerner. Motion carried.

Team Reports

Worship

Worship team shared lots of important dates on the calendar to be aware of. There is continued work in progress about different ideas for contemporary services.

CYF Team

A HUGE thank you to the CYF team for doing a fantastic job. We are still looking for an adult to organize the youth summer trip.

Outreach Team

The finishing touches are being completed for the Octoberfest on the 25th. The team will be serving pumpkin bars and cider, November 19th and the Glows parade is coming Friday, November 17th. The Thanksgiving Food Drive is starting November

5th thru November 19th. 10 % will go to the food shelf and the rest will be for the Grace Food shelf. The Sock tree and the Star tree will be in the near future as well.

Service Team

The cracks in the parking lot will be fixed by the company that completed the parking lot and should be happening soon. The stain glassed windows are ³/₄ completed and are almost paid for but still \$11,000 short yet to be paid.

Stewardship Team

The team is narrowing ideas toward helping the stewardship for the church and looking at smaller tasks to take on first. It was discussed putting together a new church directory. Also, the team is talking about ways of recognizing people who donate their time in various ways to the church as well as welcoming new people to our church.

Personnel

The team met and discussed the budget for the next year, 2024. The team recommended continuing at this time with the staffing the same. However, the committee will review the budget for a new pastor and the necessary benefits for this position.


