# "Making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." Ephesians 4:3

During the course of our lives, we have all experienced some type of conflict. Conflict happens in life and to everyone. Conflicts happen in churches too. What is important is when conflict arises, it is dealt with in a healthy way. Not dealing with the conflict, avoidance

doesn't make it go away and is not healthy. Dealing with a conflict in unhealthy ways can be worse than the conflict itself.

To have some guidance in how to handle conflicts within the church, the Church Council adopted a covenantal agreement called Agreeing and Disagreeing in Love. It is biblically based and developed by the Mennonite Church. Jesus provided a way to deal with conflicts between two parties in Matthew. He knew that we humans do get into disputes that need to be settled. He wanted a way for us to deal with a problem in a healthy productive manner. In the book of Acts, the early church had issues that needed to be addressed. The leaders met, discussed and worked things out.

The document, Agreeing and Disagreeing in Love, provides the necessary guidance for how to handle conflicts in a healthy way within the church. It sets a standard of behavior and actions that we as Christians are to follow. Jesus gave a commandment to his disciples and us. That commandment is that we should love one another. That others will know we are Jesus' disciples because of the love we show one another. We, as Christians, are called to still love one another even when we are in a disagreement. We are to work for a solution, to figure it out together, and then live together with the solution.

This covenantal agreement has helped tremendously in two churches where I served in SEMN Synod where there was disagreement. It made people feel safe that they could speak and their views would be heard. Also, unhealthy behaviors stopped. Lastly, that a solution was found so the conflict was resolved. Having this agreement won't stop disagreements, but it gives the church a healthy way to deal with them. Please take time to read the covenant agreement that the Council has passed. If you have any questions about it, feel free to ask Council members or the pastors.

## Grace Lutheran Church Council Minutes - April 16th, 2023

Present: Pete Odgren, Joice Foster, Ilene Reiter, Patti Mathews, Joshua Ensrud, Carolyn Bird, Kris Boerner, Ardell Prescott, Jane Reiman, Pastor Allison Cobb, Pastor Cheryl

- II. Not Present: Troy Nemmers
- III. Call to Order: Pete Odgren called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm.

IV. The Devotional was given today by Ilene Reiter. V. Financial Report: Jane Reiman gave the March 2023 Financial Report. She reported March giving was at \$29,500, down 43% from March 2022. The council

discussed that the staffing model may need to change to reflect the reduction in giving. A motion to approve the April 16th, 2023 Financial Report was made by Carolyn Bird Ardell seconded the motion. The Financial Report was approved by the rest of the council members.

Team Reports

CYF: Last day of B.L.A.S.T. is May 10th, 2023.VBS will be held Mon. June 12th-Thurs. June 15th with the Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp at Grace Lutheran Church from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. The council discussed student participants bringing a sack lunch with them each day they are at VBS. The church will provide a backup lunch for students who do not bring lunch. Lodging still needs to be set up for camp leadership.

Graduation Recognition is Sun. April 30th at 10:45 a.m.

The summer mission trip is July 15th-July 22nd, 2023. A female chaperone still needs to be found to go on the trip. The chaperones will be driving the van to the scheduled destinations throughout the trip.

With an opening in the Church education position, duties will be divided amongst the CYF committee lay members. Council discussed changing the CYF position from 30 hrs. to 15 hrs. This is due to the current financial figures. The council said they will create a more formal duty and schedule outline to be implemented in the Fall.

#### Worship:

Worship in the park will start June 7th and end August 31st, 2023. Grace Lutheran Church has partnered with other churches in the community to provide worship services. The council discussed improving communication with marketing this worship service.

#### Outreach

Patti Mathews is encouraging Outreach to get involved in promoting Worship in the park with various ways of advertising. She is trying to schedule various food trucks to be at the worship services as well to help draw in more people. O Scoops will charge \$400 for 100 small servings of ice cream.

#### Service:

Jane Reiman stated that the current Insurance company will be increasing their insurance premium 43% as they are getting away from insuring churches. Jane and the service team are currently in the process of getting 2 quotes. They have received one already. The premium is close to what the church is already paying. Plus, there will be additional items that will be insured under the 1st quote. The Service team is waiting on the second quote before making their final decision.

E. Fellowship: Same as Outreach

Personnel: Looking for a volunteer to fill an open position on the Personnel committee.

VII. Old Business

Technical Personnel Position: Will be reopening the position. The council discussed various ideas to make the position less complicated: using new user friendly software to tape and post services online, etc.

B. Stained Glass Window Project: Moving forward with a 2 year plan to complete the West and North wall windows. The council decided it will not use money from the trust account, but will use additional money from

other sources within the financials as they would like that money saved for any emergency projects that come up during the fiscal year.

C. Fundraising Projects: A culligan jug will be positioned in the church for the congregation to donate coins in for the project "People Helping People". An announcement will be placed in the next worship service bulletin for another project "God's Grace is Amazing Day". Core Values: The council discussed and decided to schedule a separate meeting in July to create a core values mission statement. The reason the council chose to schedule a separate meeting for this topic was so they could dedicate the time needed to complete this task.
