



THE PASTOR'S PEN

I have a few shorter thoughts for the month, but not a particular uniting theme.

· First, I congratulate you, friends in Christ at Grace Lutheran Church in Fairmont, Minnesota, on calling your new pastor, the Rev. Dr. Allison Cobb! You will all be in my prayers in the days and weeks ahead. There is plenty of time to do summarize our time together at Grace in the coming months. Today, I celebrate with you!

· There is still work to be done as your interim pastor besides preaching and leading/planning worship. My last day has not been determined as of this writing, but I will be here almost the entire summer. One focus area during these next few months is preparing for Pastor Allison's arrival. Consider that Grace Lutheran Church has not welcomed a full-time ELCA rostered pastor in over 13 years. With COVID and other transitional challenges, welcoming your new pastor presents some great opportunities to understand the congregational relationship with a pastor more deeply. I will be working with congregational leaders on a variety of fronts to make the most of this welcome and transition.

· I know that in summers past there was a pattern of alternating weeks of "traditional" and "contemporary" worship styles (I've notice that my column from a few months ago generated some discussion about titles for worship services). In the absence of a Music Coordinator or a Minister of Music (Amber and I have been covering many of these responsibilities in the interim as best we can), and that people tend to travel and have different rhythms during the summer (including musicians), having the alternating weeks of worship styles is not possible. I am scheduling musicians to lead worship as they are available. Thank you for bringing your voices to worship, regardless of the music that is present.

· Previously I had written on whether one pastor or two pastors was the best way forward for Grace Lutheran Church. The only reason I addressed the option of one pastor serving Grace was not necessarily that it was the only way forward. After multiple decades of operating under a particular pastoral staff configuration and the current availability of pastors, my purpose was to open the congregation to different staffing possibilities. The Council embraced such flexibility. I was not endorsing a singular approach to pastoral staffing; my goal was to encourage flexibility as congregational leaders complete the church staff.

- Thank you for sharing your feedback on my June 19th sermon, "What About the Pigs?". It addressed some pig history and theology. I wanted to share with you the book title and author that I gleaned much information from for the sermon. If you're interested, check out: *Lesser Beasts: A Snout-to-Tail History of the Humble Pig*, by Mark Essig.

Thank you for your ongoing support of the ministries of Grace Lutheran Church. I look forward to seeing you at Grace, and at the very least, next month at the Martin County Fair for some pork chops on a stick!

Rev. Dr. Allison Cobb

Pastor Allison Cobb is a second career pastor who God called into the ministry from a career in the food industry. She was raised in rural America where her family enjoyed their neighbors who farmed, as well as cows and horses nearby. She grew up with her sister, dog Andy, and grandparents close by.

Growing up, Pastor Allison loved basketball, 4-H, and playing the saxophone in band as well as academics. In high school, she focused on her studies along with music and sports and attended the University of Illinois, majoring in Food Science. She interned at A.E. Staley Manufacturing where she spent the summer researching a fat free donut filling and then a six-month internship following graduation, developing new Nutri-grain bars as an intern at Kellogg's, in Cereal City U.S.A, Battle Creek, Michigan. She then received her master's degree in Food Science from Michigan State University.



During her internship times, Pastor Allison realized that she loved feeding people and working with people, so she shifted her focus from product development to marketing. Hormel Foods was her next stop on the journey where she spent her first 14 months in Cincinnati, OH calling on Kroger and Supervalu and then being moved to the corporate office in Austin, MN, SPAM Town USA, where she managed hot dogs, fully cooked entrees, started the Natural Choice lunchmeat line, and oversaw the integration and management of Hormel's first chicken company, Valley Fresh out of California.


While her job took her across the country and even to visit customers around the world, her passion and her heart had shifted to serving God through work in the church. Pastor Allison's parents taught her that wherever she moved, her first priority was to find a church home and her second was to get her library card. When she moved to Austin, she found her church home not in the United Methodist Church of her upbringing, but in the friendly and welcoming people of Westminster Presbyterian. She sang in the choir, served on committees, and was the youngest person ordained as an elder to serve on Council. Being on the board of directors and coordinating Hormel volunteers with Habitat for Humanity was also incredibly meaningful.

Shortly after being ordained an elder, Pastor Allison began to hear a loud internal nudge to be a pastor and after much prayer and discernment with one of her pastors, she decided to pursue the Commissioned Lay Pastor program at University of Dubuque Theological Seminary and was called to serve part-time in that role at her church while still working full-time at Hormel. Eventually, she found herself at St. Olaf Lutheran Church in Austin where she began an ecumenical coffee house ministry and from there, continued to listen as the Spirit called her into full-time ministry. *(Pastor Allison continued on page 5)*

Sometimes there is a lot of talk in the Bible and in church about the Holy Spirit. Jesus gave the Holy Spirit to his followers according to the Gospel of John so that they may remember all of the things that Jesus taught them and remind them of God's love for them. In the book of Acts, the Holy Spirit is a guide for followers of Jesus, and also has great power to help people serve God together, often overcoming great obstacles. Paul teaches Jesus followers to "live in the Spirit". But how do you know whether the Spirit is at work in you? TIME AFTER PENTECOST

TIME AFTER PENTECOST

Persistence in prayer is encouraged by Jesus and wins the attention of God when Abraham intercedes for Sodom. The life of the baptized—to be rooted and built up in Christ Jesus—is to be nurtured with prayer. God hears and answers prayer and so strengthens God's own. "When I called, you answered me; you increased my strength within me."

TIME AFTER PENTECOST

Today's texts offer instruction and encouragement for all who are occasionally overwhelmed by the "unhappy business" of life. Jesus urges us to take care and be on guard against all kinds of greed. We who have died with Christ in holy baptism have also been raised with him and are encouraged to elevate our thinking, seeking the "things that are above." To that end we seek the sustenance of the Lord's supper and the encouragement of God's word.

Pastor Allison attended Wartburg Theological Seminary and interned at Ascension Lutheran Church in Cheyenne, WY. After graduation, she has joyfully served the good people of Holmen Lutheran Church in Holmen, WI, a bedroom community of La Crosse. As one of two pastors, she leads the outreach, hospitality, congregation care, and adult education ministries while co-leading worship, confirmation, and crisis ministry. Her passion is intergenerational ministry where she has introduced an annual Blessing of the Animals service, baking gluten free communion bread, and small group ministry, as well as several adult learning trips, retreats, book clubs, and studies. She oversees the congregation's Stephen Ministry program and introduced a Care Caller ministry to keep elders and those who may be homebound connected during the pandemic.

In the last three and a half years, Pastor Allison pursued a Doctor of Ministry degree from University of Dubuque Theological Seminary which focused on congregational vitality. Learning is a hobby, as well as reading, movies, and walking her puppy Chip. Aside from being a dog mom, her most favorite role is being an aunt! She looks forward to returning to her more rural roots, getting to know the faithful people of Grace Lutheran, living closer to family, being an active part of the Fairmont community, participating in ministry with our ecumenical partners, and sharing God's love with those she meets!

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Financial Report

Jane Reiman reviewed the financial reports. Income continues to remain steady. She also informed the council that the income tends to drop during the summer months.

Team Reports

Worship Team- Patti Mathews reported the first summer Wednesday Worship service at the Sylvania Park bandshell went well with 46 people in attendance. The Worship Team continues to work on getting the word out about these services. She also relayed there will be no communion at these services.

Children/Youth/Family Team -Ben Jordan and Joice Forster reported on the Teacher Appreciation Supper which was held on May 18, 2022, for those who led our BLAST groups. For the first year of Wednesday youth Christian education school, much went well. The majority of parents liked the change from Sunday to Wednesday. The teachers then spent time in small groups listing things that went well and things that need to be improved for next year. Nicki Kueker and the CYF team will be reviewing these suggestions at their June 14th meeting. Vacation Bible School will be

Outreach- Ilene reported that a donation from Grace Lutheran Church will be made to Hands Park. Four prayer shawls were distributed. Grace will be looking for members to deliver Meals on Wheels in the near future. Carolyn and Ilene will be meeting with the Open Door coordinator to review the year.

Service Team - Jane Reiman reported that the playground will be completed by the end of the week. The west side sanctuary windows are leaking and will need to be repaired. An upcoming project will be to restore all the stained glass windows.

Old Business

An applicant for the position for Music/Worship Director has been received. The Personnel Committee will be going over this candidate's qualifications.

Pete Odgren reported that our current constitution is working as of now. He recommended that we wait until a new lead pastor begins before we explore changing to the the ELCA recommended church constitution.

The Parish Nurse position idea will be tabled until a new lead pastor is here.

God's Grace is Amazing Day was discussed by the council. The council is looking for a person or committee to lead this very positive, worthwhile event. A decision will need to be made on this by the July 17, 2022 council meeting.

New Business

The current Call Committee has indicated they are willing to continue as Grace Lutheran searches for an associate pastor. Pete moved to keep the current Call Committee in place to find an associate pastor. Ben seconded. Motion passed.


The meeting was adjourned at 12:10PM with the Lord's Prayer.



Summer Thoughts







Vacation Bible School - July 18-21, 2022


