

- P: Provide your Spirit's guidance to envelope all who minister in your church, including our musicians, teams, and volunteers. We pray for powerful unity and oneness as the body of Christ. May the work of your church always be done in a loving and respectful way, full of your grace and truth, in accordance with our faith.
